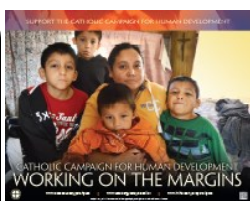

CATHOLIC CAMPAIGN FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT

The Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) was founded in 1970 by the Catholic bishops of the United States as their domestic anti-poverty program. Designed to address the policies and structures that perpetuate poverty to create sustainable solutions, CCHD empowers poor and marginalized people to join together and make decisions to improve their lives and neighborhoods. A special collection will be held this **Sunday, November 19** for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development. Twenty-five percent of this collection will remain within the diocese. The Diocese of Alexandria will use its twenty-five percent portion of the collection for these local efforts: 33.3% for the Central Louisiana Homeless Coalition, 33.3% to Manna House and 33.3% for the work of the Office of Life and Justice. **Please be generous this Sunday, Nov. 19th.**

WORLD DAY OF THE POOR, NOVEMBER 19, 2017

This Sunday, November 19, we observe the first World Day of the Poor. In his apostolic letter to close the Year of Mercy, Pope Francis suggested the Catholic Church set aside one day each year when communities can “reflect on how poverty is at the very heart of the Gospel.” He designated this day as the World Day of the Poor and it will be celebrated on the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time each year.

This day is meant to heighten our awareness of poverty, and offers some practical ways that we can be of service to the poor throughout the year. One way is to practice the Corporal Works of Mercy. Drawn from Jesus' life and teachings, the Corporal Works of Mercy call us to: feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, shelter the homeless, visit the sick and imprisoned, bury the dead and give alms to the poor. Pope Francis added a new work of mercy: to care for God's creation. The Corporal Works of Mercy offer a clear model and starting point for how to care for our neighbors in need.

But there is so much more. While “giving alms” is important and vital, participating in a Thanksgiving Food Drive or making a donation to the Poor Box is not enough. We must learn about the causes of poverty and work to change them.

There are many reasons why people around the world are trapped in poverty: lack of jobs, war and climate change that affects what farmers can grow are only a few examples. We can raise our voices together to ask our government to support policies that help address these causes of poverty.
